These winter birding trips are special events on the calendar no matter where they are undertaken. On this minus 11 degree Celsius morning with that 10 kilometre wind blowing our 15 undeterred observers gathered at Sullivan's Pond in Dartmouth on that Saturday morning for what has become an annual HRM/HFN annual birding event. The group birded all the way from Sullivan's Pond to Eastern Passage's Hartlen Point, making the usual stops, while recording a total of 42 species.
